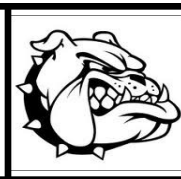

## A Note from the Principal....

Welcome to the Second Semester. This new beginning is always a wonderful opportunity to reflect on ways to enrich our future. At FHS, our faculty and staff have shared with students the importance of continuing to focus on their academics as they move closer to third nine weeks exams, and the GEE and EOC assessments later this school year. Yes, that is right; students WILL TAKE THIRD NINE WEEK EXAMS THIS YEAR. In previous years, the school district did not schedule 3rd nine week exams due to the state GEE testing schedule. However, changes were made to the tests and schedule in order for us to facilitate third nine weeks exams. Consequently, twenty percent of your student's third nine weeks grade will be based on the grade they earn on the exam. We would also like to remind parents and students that students are not allowed to check out during exams and are not allowed to take exams early unless approved by Mr. Vitrano. Exams will be held March 5th through 8th. Please discuss this significant change with your child as well as assist him/her in reflecting upon his/her progress to develop a plan for success. We continue to encourage all parents and guardians to monitor their child's grades weekly by logging on to STI Home. To quote our amazing Drew Brees, "Let's finish strong!"

On March 27, FHS will host our Second Annual Career Day. Last year's event was a success, and many of our students benefited from the perspective that our generous guest speakers shared. This year, the event is open to students in grades 10th through 12th. 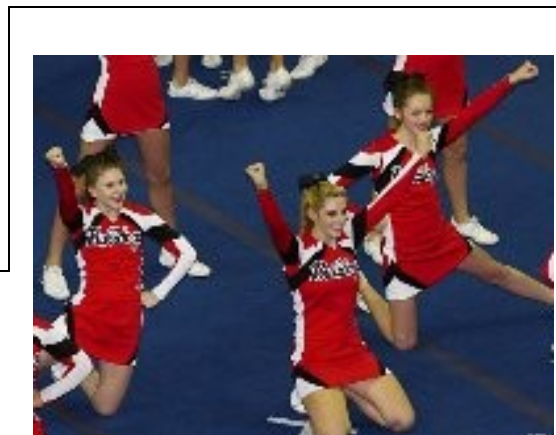

# Guidance Department:

## **SCHEDULING**

Scheduling for the 2012-2013 school year will begin soon. Please talk with your child about the courses he/she needs to take for graduation and for his/her specific career cluster. In a homeroom prior to scheduling, students will complete an IGP (Individual Graduation Plan) which indicates their chosen career cluster and will bring their IGP home for a parent/guardian signature. It is mandatory that each student have an IGP on file. Electives for each student will be selected from the courses identified in the student's career cluster. Therefore, the selection of the career cluster must be taken seriously.

More specific information about the scheduling process will be given at a later date.

## **FRESHMEN PARENTS**

Beginning January 22, FHS will offer tutoring on Saturday mornings from 8:00am until 12:00pm in the FHS library. The purpose of this program is to provide remediation for 9th graders struggling in one or more of the core subjects: English, Algebra, Physical Science, and World Geography. Education majors from Southeastern Louisiana University have been invited to provide instruction to individual students or small groups of students. **Sophomore Parents:** We received the PLAN scores this month. PLAN is a pre-ACT assessment test which helps focus a student's test preparation skills to improve ACT scores and provides an estimated ACT assessment composite score. Your student took this exam in October. Spend some time to discuss thoroughly the score report including the career paths. Some highlights include: test score, composite score, national percentile rank, estimated ACT composite score range, educational plans, career interest preferences, and identifying job possibilities. We will use this information to help develop and/or revise your student's IGP.

## **AP TESTS**

Students wishing to register for an AP test must have their money in to their AP teacher by March 23. Each test is \$87.00. Tests will be given in May.

## **PROSPECTIVE COLLEGE ATHLETES**

If so, now is the time for juniors and seniors to register with the NCAA Clearinghouse. Register at the following website: [www.eligibilitycenter.org](http://www.eligibilitycenter.org). You cannot participate in any postsecondary sport if you are not cleared through the eligibility center.

**SENIOR PARENTS** - The senior counselors distributed a newsletter to the seniors in January. In addition to the newsletter they received information on federal student loans.

**Financial Aid** - It is time to apply for financial aid. Follow the steps below.

1. Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at the following website: [www.fafsa.gov](http://www.fafsa.gov). Using FAFSA on the Web is faster than using the paper copy. If you do not have access to a computer and need a paper FAFSA, the school counselor's office will be receiving a few paper copies within the next month. This is the form you complete to be considered for pell grants, loans, work study programs, etc. If you prefer to fill something out in writing before applying online, you can download and print the FAFSA on the Web Worksheet. The counselors have requested copies of the worksheet for the entire senior class. They will be distributed as soon as they arrive. Seniors who are applying to out of state or private schools may need to complete an additional form called the CSS/ Financial Aid Profile. If you are not sure, please check with the individual colleges and ask about their deadlines.

2. Apply for a Federal Student Aid PIN, Personal Identification Number. Apply at [www.pin.ed.gov](http://www.pin.ed.gov). The PIN allows you to sign the FAFSA electronically. For dependent students, both you and a parent must have a PIN. The PIN allows you to make corrections to the FAFSA online.

3. Apply as soon as possible after January 1, 2012. You have until June 30, 2013, to submit your FAFSA, BUT YOU NEED TO APPLY EARLY! Schools often use FAFSA information to award nonfederal aid. The deadlines are usually early in the year. You should check with the schools you are interested in for their deadlines.

.4.Review your Student Aid Report (SAR). After you apply, you will receive a Student Aid Report. Your SAR contains information reported on your FAFSA. Review your SAR when you receive it and make any necessary changes or corrections. The colleges you list on your FAFSA will get your SAR data electronically.

#### HOW DO I APPLY FOR TOPS????

1. There are two methods for applying for a TOPS scholarship. (1) FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) [www.fafsa.gov](http://www.fafsa.gov) and (2) TOPS Online Application – [www.osfa.la.gov](http://www.osfa.la.gov). The TOPS online application may be completed by students who can certify that they do not qualify for federal grant aid. NOTE: In the event of a budget shortfall, students completing the TOPS online application will be the first to lose their TOPS award.
2. Application Deadlines for 2012 Graduates: If your initial FAFSA is received after July 1 immediately following your graduation from high school, the payment of your TOPS award could be delayed depending on the date your application is received and the date you enroll for the first time as a full time student in an eligible college or university. If you enroll for the first time as a full time student before your FAFSA is received, you must meet the TOPS Continuation Eligibility Requirements to receive payments of your TOPS award after the first semester, quarter, or term of your full time enrollment at an eligible college or university
3. ACT Deadlines for 2012 Graduates: April 14, 2012 is the deadline to take the ACT and earn a composite of at least a 20 without any penalty. If you take the ACT on June 9, 2012 and earn an ACT composite of 20 you will lose one semester of eligibility. Students who fail to achieve a qualifying ACT score by July 1 of the graduating year shall not be considered for an award.

Do you have the GPA to qualify for TOPS? You can use the following website to calculate your predicted TOPS GPA: <http://college.stpsb.org/TOPS.htm> You may also contact LOSFA (Louisiana Office of Student Financial Aid) by calling 1-800-259-5626 or contact them by e-mail [atcustserv.@osfa.state.la.us](mailto:atcustserv.@osfa.state.la.us) or [www.osfa.state.la.us](http://www.osfa.state.la.us).

Selective Service: What YOU need to know about Registering with Selective Service. Selective service is a government agency whose job is to provide untrained manpower for the Armed Forces if there's a national emergency. The law says that all 18 year old men must register. If you fail to register, you cannot qualify for federal student grants or loans for college, job training benefits, and many state and federal jobs.

You can register with Selective Service at [www.sss.gov](http://www.sss.gov).

LSU: The LSU Spring Invitational Program is limited to invited students only. It will be held March 28-30. Participants must meet the qualifications listed below to receive an invitation. Invitation postcards and emails will be sent out the third week in January! Please do not attempt to register for the program until you receive an invitation.

1. Your application fee, transcript, and official test scores should be on file with the admissions office by January 13, 2012.
2. You must have an academic GPA of at least 3.20 and an SAT total score of at least 1250 or an ACT composite score of at least 28.
3. Your official SAT or ACT score(s) must be on file with the LSU Office of Undergraduate Admissions.
4. You must complete the online reservation form as early as possible.

If you are close to meeting these requirements, you may be considered for the Level 2 or Level 3 invitation criteria. Level 2 and Level 3 invitations will be mailed if space is available after the initial reservation deadline. The initial reservation deadline is March 20, 2012.

Level 2: A 2.90 academic GPA and either an SAT total score of 1250 or greater or an ACT composite of 28 or greater.

Level 3: A 3.20 academic GPA and either an SAT total score of 1210 or greater or an ACT composite score of 27 or greater.

## PTSA Membership Report

Fontainebleau High has around 1600 students. Fontainebleau High PTSA has 750 members. That is LESS than one parent or caregiver per student that have joined PTSA. We have 100% teacher membership so that counts for 130 of those members. We have 50 memberships that were purchased by our corporate/community sponsors. 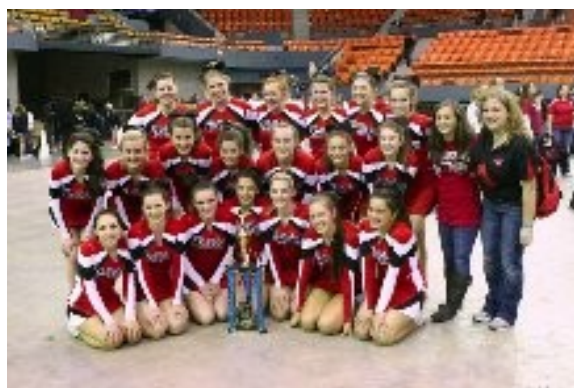
